




If everyone recruited just one new member, we'd be set. Member Applications are readily available in the hallway across from the Membership Board. Take a few and hand them to friends who may be eligible.

President Signs GI Bill Improvement Bill

President Obama recently signed legislation (H.R. 1383) that increases the tuition cap to \$27,000 for some veterans currently attending private schools. In order to qualify for the increased benefit, the veteran must have been enrolled in a private school before last year's reform bill (The Post-9/11 Veterans Assistance Improvement Act) capped private school tuition at \$17,500. The reform measure created a problem for veterans already enrolled in higher-priced, private programs and Rep. Jeff Miller (Fla.), chairman of the House Veterans' Affairs Committee, introduced the legislation to ensure these veterans will be able to complete their education using the benefits specified in the original Post-9/11 GI Bill, which was enacted in 2008.


